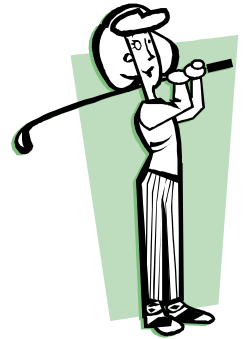

NEWS from the Pinewild Men's Golf Association

The 7th Mid-Carolina Men's Golf Association event was held at Kings Grant Golf and Country Club on Monday, July 19th 2010. The weather was a little warm and steamy, but temps were in the low 90's and a good breeze kept the air moving. Pinewild took team honors with 710 strokes, followed by Pinehurst at 717 and Anderson Creek at 719. Special congratulations to Marv Houghton of Anderson Creek as our medalist with the only sub-par round of 70 (Low GROSS) and Artie Messbauer of Seven Lakes for his Low NET of 63. John Cashion placed 2nd in the net with a 65, with Johann Rudzitis shooting 67 and finishing 7th, Bob Watt with 68 for 11th and Pete Nehlsen shooting 68 good enough for 12th. Pinewild still holds the lead by 78 strokes over Woodlake and 85 strokes ahead of Pinehurst Resort and Country Club which is in 3rd place

Although the course was set up short, 5300 yards from the White tees, the scores reflected that not all courses have to be 7000 yards or Par 72 to give you a good test of golf. Most of the individual and team scores were very comparable to all of our other events on Par 72 courses at 6000 yards or more.

Special thanks to Ron Stevenson (Director of Golf) and Brock White (Head PGA Professional) and his entire staff for running a great event for us. They provided a nice continental breakfast with rolls and coffee, had the course marked well, painted the cups for us and had an outstanding scoreboard with very quick posting of individual and team scores. Everyone also appreciated and heavily used the extra iced bottled water distributed over the course on such a hot and steamy day.

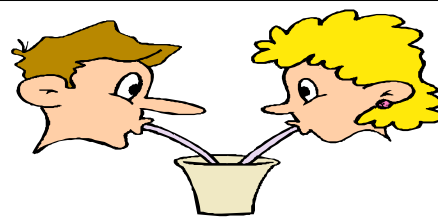

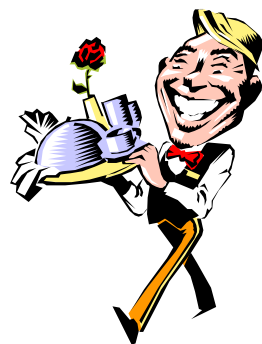

Wow...with the very hot June, and now the oppressive heat in late July, many things at the Pinewild has been challenging...particularly the task of keeping the bent grass greens alive. The course maintenance folks have been doing a very good job thus far, with the putting green surfaces remaining in good healthy condition despite the heat. We continue to ask for your patience as you encounter workers “misting” the greens and/or performing other important tasks on the greens during play.

We will be conducting our final greens aeration of the year at the end of August [the 23rd through the 26th], which will give just enough time to have the courses in tournament shape for the fall season and the Member/Guest. This includes the first qualifying stage for the PGA Tour, which will be contested over the Magnolia course starting October 25th, as well as the return of the Carolinas PGA Pro-Pro Championship on the 30th of November and the 2nd of December.
