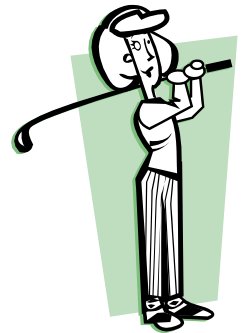

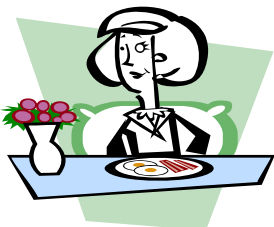
PINEWILD MEN'S GOLF ASSOCIATION
