Sue Rantala won the 50/50. She won \$175.00. The Susan B. Komen Foundation also received \$175.00.

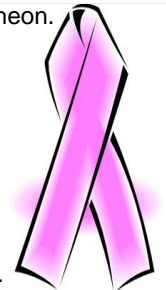
