

Blazer Tournament

Entries Open:	Open Date: mid-February – Close Date: mid-March. Play begins early April.
Registration:	Open to all PMGA members. Singles are welcome to sign up at the Pro Shop and will be paired, if at all possible.
Entry Fee:	\$15 per person/\$30 per team.
Field Limit:	64 two-man teams.
Format:	The Blazer tournament will be two-man team match play off the low handicap player using the USGA recommended method. For Four-Ball Match Play, two play their better ball against the better ball of two other players. The low handicap player plays scratch and each of the three other players is allowed 100 percent of the difference. The field will be divided into flights based on the low handicap player on each team. Ladder-formatted pairing sheets will be kept up to date and posted in the locker room. Each match must be played within a one-month period. Ample time is allowed for the matches to be played, however if the teams cannot come to an agreement on the date of play and neither team can play when the other wants to, whichever team shows up and plays before the last day will be declared the winner. If neither team shows up, both forfeit. While the format of the tournament is better ball of a two-man team, if one team member is unable to play, his partner may play the match for his team. Also, one member can play one member. If the match is not played, both teams will forfeit. Teams must play within the scheduled round dates in order to win a forfeit. If there is to be a forfeit, you must notify the PMGA tournament chairman BEFORE you play your round. Without this notification, and resulting discussion, the round will be invalid and no forfeit will be awarded. In extreme circumstances where a match cannot be played in the defined time period, the Chairman of the tournament will make the decision on any extension.
Course:	To facilitate potential scheduling conflicts, the Blazer Tournament elimination rounds may be played on either the Holly Course or the Magnolia Course, provided both teams agree with the match venue. If agreement is not forthcoming between the two teams, the default course designation is the Magnolia. Flight Championships shall be decided only on the Magnolia Course. The overall Championship match shall be decided only on the Magnolia Course.
Dates for each round:	Round 1: During April Round 2: During May Round 3: During June Round 4: During July Round 5: During August Round 6: During September/October
Tees:	All competitors will use the Blue, White, Gold, Red, or Green tees based on declaration and eligibility and handicaps will be adjusted accordingly. Players will use these tees for all matches.
Flights:	Teams will be flighted by team handicap. Competition will consist of flights of eight teams each. The number of flights will be determined by the number of teams participating.



Handicaps:	Handicaps will be those in effect on the day of play. Play is at 100% of a player's handicap. Strokes will be based on the low handicap in a foursome. There will be no penalty for handicap differentials on a team. Scorecards must be signed by all players competing in a match. Incomplete, incorrect, or unsigned cards will be grounds for disqualification of a team. Competitors are responsible for verifying participants' handicaps. Handicap holes are played as defined on the card even if you start on the back nine.
Prizes:	Prize money will be awarded at the PMGA final in November to the Championship Team, runners-up and flight winners. The championship team members will also receive blazers at the Blazer Winner's Dinner in November. The names of the flight winners and the overall champion will also be engraved on the permanent plaque kept in the locker room.
Posting:	Post scores as a Home score.
