Entries Open:	N/A
Registration:	The Medal Series Team Championship is a competition between the four flights of the season long Medal Series tournament. Players from each flight at the end of the season play will qualify and play as a team. The format is match play. The total points accumulated over the three days of competition decide the team championship.
Entry Fee:	The entry fee is included in the Medal Series fee.
Field:	Flight Teams from the Medal Series.
Field Limit:	Field limited to four teams (flights) – number of players based on Medal Series entries. The participants in each flight qualify by accumulation the most net points in four of eight Medal Series events.
Format:	The Three-Day Medal Series Team Championship will be a competition between the four flights of the season long Medal Series tournament. The players with the highest accumulated net points from each net flight at the end of the season will qualify and play as a team. The low net score for the four rounds used in the Medal Series will break ties for all flights. If the first low net is tied, then the next low net will be used and so on until the tie is broken. The format is a three-day round robin match play competition. Each team (flight) will play each other over three days. The captain for each flight will be determined based on the same tie breakers used for prizes in the NET category and based on his willingness to serve as Flight Captain. Each round will consist of nine holes of foursome's match play and nine holes of four-ball match play. The total points accumulated over the three days of competition decide the team championship, 1 point for each hole won, ½ point for each hole halved.
Course:	Magnolia and Holly.
Dates for each round:	Mid-October. Actual dates to be announced.
Tees:	Players will use their registered tees, based on eligibility.
Flights:	Same flights as determined during the Medal Series.
Handicaps:	The championship competition will be match play off the low handicap using the USGA recommended method. For Four-Ball Match Play, two play their better ball against the better ball of two other players. The low handicap player plays scratch and each of the three other players is allowed 100 percent of the difference. For Foursome Match Play, partners play alternately from the teeing grounds and alternately during the play of each hole. The lower handicapped side competes at scratch. Each team handicap is established by taking 50% of the sum of the individual handicap at 100%.
Prizes:	The names of the Medal Series Championship flight winners will be engraved on the permanent plaque kept in the locker room.
